
The Jesus Storybook Bible Guided Reading Plan



The Jesus Storybook Bible Guided Reading Plan

This 44-day guided reading plan is designed to help parents take a step toward family disciple-making with their young children while using the Jesus Storybook Bible by Sally Lloyd Jones. We pray this resource deepens your relationship with God and with each other. For each day there are four sections to complete as a family:



Pray - Start out your family devotional time with a prayer inviting the Lord into your time together, learning about His Word.



Read - Together, read one story per day from the Jesus Storybook Bible. Each story in the Storybook Bible is taken from Scripture. This Scripture is included as an optional extension to explore with your family for more context.



Create - After reading the section for the day, you will have the opportunity to get creative and apply what was read by making either a salt dough figure (recipe included on next page) to represent the story or drawing a picture on a piece of paper or in a journal. You could use a notebook you have or staple paper together to create your own! The salt dough figures can be painted once dry or left as they are. When the reading plan is completed, the figures and drawings will create a timeline that families can put in order together to recall the stories and visually see the whole story of Jesus in the Bible from beginning to end.

For children too young to draw in a journal or make salt dough figures, there are coloring pages for each day available under the Bibles and Devotionals section on the Family Disciple-Making website. medinaeast.gracechurches.org/familydisciplemaking/

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Memorize - Every 5 days of the plan, there will be a new verse that goes along with the theme of the stories, for you to memorize with your family. That's 9 verses you will have memorized by the end of this plan! Memorizing scripture is an amazing Biblical practice that can be done easily with your kids even at a young age.

Salt Dough Recipe

Ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour (can use gluten free if needed)

- 1 cup salt
- 1 cup water

Instructions:

*We recommend covering your work/play area with an <u>inexpensive plastic tablecloth</u> to make cleanup easier!



- 1. Combine the **flour** and **salt** in a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Gradually add water while stirring and mixing to form a dough with a Play-Doh like consistency.
- 3. Form the dough into a ball and knead for approximately 5-7 minutes, until the dough is smooth and firm. Additional water may be needed, depending upon humidity. Add a teaspoon of water at a time until the dough reaches the proper texture. On the other hand, if the dough is too sticky, add more flour by the teaspoon until it's no longer tacky.
- 4. Store the salt dough in a Ziploc bag when it's not in use to prevent it from drying out. Dough will last about 1 week when stored this way.

Baking and Painting:

-The salt dough crafts can be air dried or baked although air drying takes a lot longer.

-If you want to bake your salt dough crafts, place them on a foil-covered baking sheet in a 250-degree oven. Baking time will vary depending on the size and thickness of your crafts. For each 1/4" in thickness, allow approximately a half hour of baking time, or bake until surface turns light golden brown. Turn each piece frequently so that they dry out evenly. If an area puffs up, poke a hole in it with a pin or toothpick to release the air.

-After baking your salt dough crafts, you can choose to paint them and then apply a coat of Modge Podge to ensure it lasts a long time! Store your completed salt dough crafts in an old egg carton or shoebox to access later!

Then when the last plague passed over Egypt, the houses with doors stained with the blood of the lamb would not be touched because the lamb died in their place. Mold a doorframe out of salt dough and paint it to show the shed blood that saved them. You could also draw the doorframe in your journal!


